PAINTED TOAST WORSHIP GOD THROUGH ART!

ITEMS NEEDED:

- White bread
- Food coloring
- Milk
- Items to 'paint' with (i.e. Q-tips, small paint brushes)
- Bowls

DIRECTIONS:

Place a small amount of milk into your bowls (you will need enough for every color you would like to use)

Squeeze a few drops of food coloring into each bowl and stir to mix

Give everyone a piece of bread and allow them to express themselves through art and create a masterpiece by painting their piece of bread with the colored milk, using Q-tips or brushes


- **Be sure to tell them this is edible paint and made with milk so it's okay to eat
- **You will also want to be sure they don't soak the bread with 'paint', you just want enough so you can see your painting

Once the artists are finished, pop the bread in the toaster for a few seconds or in the oven under the broiler. Add a little butter if desired and enjoy!

SCIENCE EXPERIMENT MIRROR IMAGES

"And we, who with unveiled faces all reflect the Lord's glory, are being transformed into his likeness with ever-increasing glory, which comes from the Lord, who is the Spirit." 2 Corinthians 3:18

This Scripture says that we're to reflect the Lord's glory and worship and praise him.

YOU'LL NEED:

- one Bible
- provided mirror
- a wallet-size school photo or Polaroid photo of each child.

THE EXPERIMENT:

Take the mirror and have kids take turns looking at Bible text reflected in the mirror. Ask:

- What do you see?

Say: Mirrors produce a reflection that appear backwards because light waves reflect straight off the surface. But a face in the mirror is different; it doesn't look backward in a mirror because it's symmetrical, which means that when the image is divided, both halves look the same. Let's test this concept together.

Have kids take turns looking into the mirror. Ask:

- What unique facial qualities do you see in the mirror?
- Do you think one side of your face looks exactly like the other side? Why or why not?

Have kids take out their photos. Demonstrate how to hold the edge of the mirror perpendicular to the photo. Half of the face should reflect into the mirror, making the photo and reflection look like a whole face. Allow time for each child to test the mirror concept.

- Did this experiment reflect an image in the mirror that you would easily recognize, or does the image look like a stranger to you?

Read aloud 2 Corinthians 3:18 again. Say: This Scripture says that we're to reflect the Lord's glory.

Ask:

- What do you think that reflection looks like?
- Is the Lord's glory something we can see in a mirror? Explain.
- How can we praise and worship in the Lord's Glory?

Say: Your life is a reflection of a life that's been changed by God; your actions and how you worship Him can reveal what God is like. Take another look at your reflection in the mirror.
